HAZARD	RISK	CONTROL MEASURES
Minor injury from sports participation i.e. pulled muscle/sprained ankle	Medium	<p>Players to participate in warm-up and cooldown. If late, players will be asked to complete their own warm-up before joining in with the session.</p> <p>All players given advice on correct footwear and kit; coaches will ensure this is adhered to prior to participation.</p> <p>Jewellery must be removed as per AENA rules. If it cannot be removed it must be taped.</p> <p>1st aid bag present for all training sessions, to include ice packs.</p> <p>Nails must be short as per AENA rules.</p> <p>If there is bleeding, the player must leave the court immediately whilst attending to injury.</p>

<p>Major injury i.e. broken bone, dislocation, cardiac arrest</p>	<p>Low</p>	<p>1st aid bag and qualified 1st aider present for all training sessions.</p> <p>Ambulance called in the case of an emergency. Nearest A&E is John Radcliffe.</p> <p>Emergency contact details kept with all coaches and team managers. Accident form to be completed for any incidents and committee made aware.</p>
<p>Dehydration</p>	<p>Low/Medium</p>	<p>All players asked to bring fluids.</p> <p>Water fountain available next to the court to re fill bottles.</p>
<p>Player well-being and safe play</p>	<p>Low</p>	<p>All players are required to bring to the attention of the captain/coach or manager any conditions/injuries or concerns that may affect safe participation in the sport.</p> <p>If the coach believes it is not safe to participate the player will be advised not to take part.</p> <p>Individuals are advised it is their responsibility to play within the rules. Consistent failure to do so or dangerous play will be reported to the Committee.</p> <p>Coaches/Team Managers record player attendance via register.</p>

		<p>Junior players are dropped off and collected to the court by parents/guardian.</p> <p>Ratio of 1:10 (junior) 1:12 (adults) is adhered to for player/coaches.</p> <p>The session is limited to 30 players.</p> <p>All sessions will be delivered by qualified level 1 & 2 coaches. All coaches will also have a valid England Netball DBS, Safeguarding Children and Emergency Aid qualification.</p> <p>No spectators are allowed, training is a closed session.</p>
Facilities and equipment	Low	<p>Coaches arrive to the venue prior to players to inspect the court and complete risk assessment checklist.</p> <p>The court area is kept clean, with clearly defined playing lines.</p> <p>There is sufficient run off and no obstruction.</p> <p>The posts are in good condition and are weighted.</p> <p>The lighting is good provides full court coverage.</p> <p>Should there be any issues with the venue, the Facilities Manager will be contacted to resolve.</p> <p>Changing and toilet facilities are provided next to the court.</p>

		<p>Equipment is checked prior to each session to ensure clean, safe and fit for purpose.</p> <p>The moving of equipment i.e posts, balls and kit bag is actioned in a safe manner. All members will move items as per the specific safety guidelines, and multiple members will carry heavy items.</p>
Fire evacuation	Low	<p>In the case of a fire, everyone will evacuate via the nearest fire exit and meet at the emergency meeting point (car park). The coach/team manager will check the register.</p> <p>Emergency services will be called.</p>
